Emailed Scottish Government regarding asset transfer from Forward Coupar Angus – awaiting reply.

Pond workshops over next 3 weeks as SMF pond is established.

Spoon carver interested in doing workshop on SMF. No additional staff time would be required. The person holding the workshop has their own public liability insurance.

Ridge Clean Energy have contacted AT. This company are doing work in Rottal. Invitation for SK team to visit Rottal. The board were keen to hear from Ridge Clean Energy and visit Rottal. AT will liaise with Ridge Clean Energy (Action 55).

Community Enterprise Scotland have offered 6 days free consultancy including Board training session on Good Governance. Board keen to accept the offer of this training. Evenings and in person meetings generally preferred. AT to liaise with Margaret around dates (Action 56).

ARP: KM has spoken with Scott at ARP. AT working up application for feasibility study and community engagement for expanding SK growing space. Approx. 16-20 days plus 4-6 study visits. SK keen for AT to do this work one day/week. However, would need to backfill AT post, and outsource staff resource for tattie day.

School grower: one of the local schools has secured funding to support a school grower. School would like SK to employ grower. Would be one day/week. There would be some class contact but SK's experience is that this should be no more than 10 children at a time. AT/CL are meeting and will produce a proposal relating to

school growing (Action 57). Would need MoU between school and SK (Action 58).

#### 6. Workforce/HR

Board agree that staff can have 3 weeks of annual leave in a row providing it's agreed by the PM or for the PM the board/chair, providing it does not conflict with periods of high activity/events the staff member will need to attend.

Property – School Wynd. The property is a good space for SK although would need some work doing to it if we successfully purchased it. Scottish Land Fund is not really designed for purchasing private property from the market. However, could still apply to SLF but it can take some time and it depends on how motivated the seller is to sell to SK. Scottish Land Fund provides 95% of the funds. Therefore would need additional funding for remaining 5% plus the work required on the building after purchase. For SLF – constitution should specify that members need to live in the area. Board agree for AG to speak to SLF and the agent/seller (Action 65).
